His part meant so much to him and he never wanted his picture or name in the newspaper. All Roy ever wanted to do was something for someone else and then ask when will we help somebody again. His Over the Hill Carry Card Club will miss him, but will never forget him and his memory will be with them forever. There is no doubt that God will enjoy Roy's company, but more importantly God will tell Roy that his lifetime love for the other guy makes everything good, both here on earth and in Heaven.
