Harry E. Coomer 81 of Fenton, MO formerly of Centralia, passed away Monday, May 07, 2012 at St. Anthony's de Greeff Hospice House in St. Louis. Mr. Coomer was born December 4, 1930 in Heyworth, son of John Coomer and Laura (Pearson) Coomer. He married Constance "Billie" (Dodillet) Coomer on December 29, 1962 in Centralia and she preceded him in death on July 10, 2000.
