Joseph "Joe" Lukasik, 67, of Centralia, passed away Wednesday, September 18, 2019 at his home.

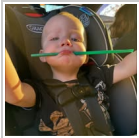

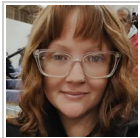
