



## Kenneth Oestreich

April 21, 1935 - July 5, 2015

Kenneth J. Oestreich, 80 of Centralia, passed away Sunday, July 5, 2015 at his home. He was born April 21, 1935 in Centralia, son of Theodore Oestreich and Blanche (Cross) Oestreich. He married Sarah Heyduck on April 21, 1961 in Centralia and she survives in Centralia.
