March 10, 1918 - January 19, 2013

Margaret Louise Lazaretti, age 94, passed away in Kenyon, Minn., on January 19, 2013. She was born March 10, 1918, to Guy and Lulu Pugh of Minneapolis. Margaret graduated from Roosevelt High School in Minneapolis and earned a degree in nursing education from the University of Minnesota, then served in the Army Nurse Corps during WWII in the South Pacific. During the war she met Raymond Franklin Lazaretti, and the two married in Minneapolis on September 17, 1944. Margaret and Ray moved to Hopkins, Minn., where they raised six children. They were members of Colonial Congregational Church in Edina, and later charter members of Chapel Hills Congregational Church. In 1962 the family moved to Centralia, Ill., Ray's hometown. There, Margaret and Ray were members of First Methodist Church. They funded the construction of a teen recreation building, and Margaret was active in Girl Scouts and the Red Cross. Throughout her life Margaret delighted in china painting and playing bridge. She also loved to travel, and with her family she traveled extensively in the United States and to Central America, South America, Switzerland, China, Singapore, Thailand and Hong Kong. Margaret was preceded in death by her husband Raymond, parents Guy and Lulu Pugh, brother Merlin ("Bob"), and daughter Helen Jean Mohr. She is survived by her children Gene (Delores), Connie, Harold (Maggi), Mary (Mark), and Michael; as well as her brother Ralph (Jeannette), son-in-law Barry Mohr, sister-in-law Phyllis Blume; many nieces and nephews; many grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and great-great grandchildren; and
