Marlene S. Goodman, 85, of Weldon Spring, Missouri, formerly of Centralia, passed away Saturday, March 30, 2019 at her home.

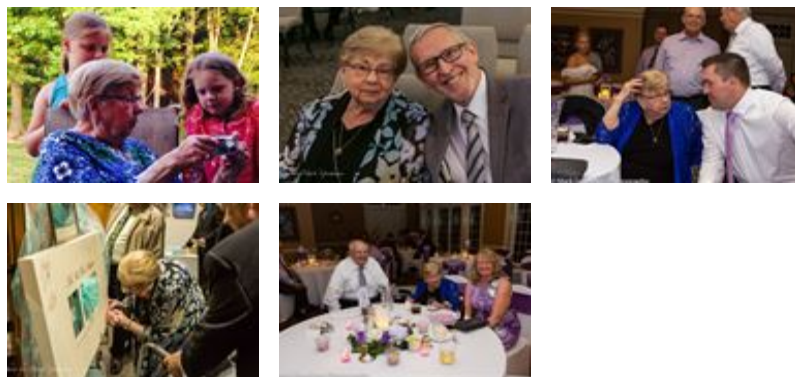
