Pauline Ryan 87 of Centralia, passed away Tuesday May 29, 2012 at Centralia Manor in Centralia. Mrs. Ryan was born May 30, 1924 in Pearl, Mississippi, daughter of Jeff D. Parker and Ethel (Russum) Parker. She married John "Jack" Ryan on October 12, 1947 and he preceded her in death on January 22, 1997. She is survived by two sons: John R. Ryan, Jr. of Centralia and J.
